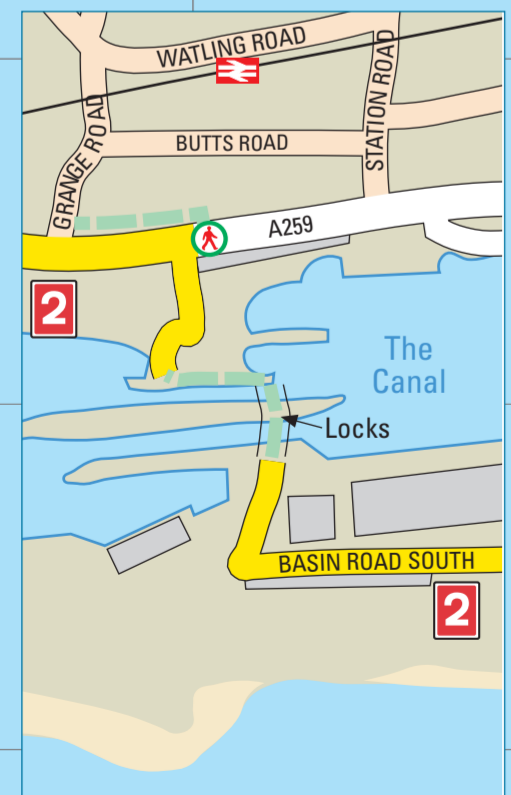

Advanced Stop Lines
 These are designed to improve safety and convenience for cyclists. When in advanced positions, cyclists can be seen by motorists, thus reducing conflict as vehicles turn left.

Advanced CYCLE stop line
 Cyclists must stay behind the advanced cycle stop line and must only proceed when the lights are green.

Motor vehicle stop line
 Motorists must stay behind the motor vehicle stop line and not obstruct the forward area.
